Notice is hereby given that sealed bids will be received at the Office of the Purchasing Agent, Clifford J. Hurgin Municipal Center, 1 School Street, Bethel, Connecticut, until 2:00 PM, June 25, 2015, for the following purpose:

Hickok Tank and Former Pump Station Demolition

Said bids will be opened publicly and read aloud at a meeting of the Procurement Committee on June 25, 2015, at 2:15 PM at the Clifford J. Hurgin Municipal Center, 1 School Street, Bethel, Connecticut.

The Work involves the demolition of the Hickok Water Storage Tank and the Former Pump Station building across from Martino Lane. All Bid Alternates must be included in the Bid.

A mandatory pre-bid conference will be held at Clifford J. Hurgin Municipal Center, Engineering Department, 1 School Street, Bethel, CT, 06801 on Thursday, June 11, 2015 at 10 A.M. Attendance is mandatory and participation is encouraged.

Contract Documents to bidders may be obtained at the office of the Purchasing Agent (Frank N. Ventrella), Bethel Municipal Center, 1 School Street, Bethel, Connecticut 06801. Phone: 203-794-8514. Contract Documents may be obtained upon payment of a non-refundable fee of \$30 per set. All requests for mailed documents must be accompanied by an additional non-refundable fee of \$30 to cover postage and handling. Checks should be made payable to Town of Bethel.

The Contract Documents may be examined at the following locations:

Each bidder must submit a single sealed envelope, the outside of which must be clearly marked Bid 15-04 "Hickok Tank and Former Pump Station Demolition." Each bid shall be accompanied by a bid security in the form of a certified, treasurer's or cashier's check or bid bond in the sum of ten percent (10%) of the bid price.

After the opening of the bids, no bid can be withdrawn for a period of ninety (90) days.

TRC Solutions of Windsor, Connecticut has conducted hazardous materials surveys at the Hickok Water Storage Tank and the former pump station near Martino Lane. The investigation included lead and asbestos testing. A copy of the report is included in Appendix B of the specifications. The hazardous materials investigation report is not part of the Contract Documents and is not a warranty of all materials conditions. However, the report is available for bidders review at the above mentioned locations where Contract Documents may be examined.

The Town of Bethel is an Affirmative Action/Equal Employment Opportunity employer. Minority / Women Business Enterprises are encouraged to bid. The Board of Selectmen upon recommendation of the Procurement Committee reserves the right to accept and /or reject any portion of said bid; to waive any technicality in any bid or part thereof and to accept any bid as provided for in Section 8-13c of the Charter of the Town of Bethel.
